You will see the Y'ules that have many different costumes from folklore all over the world. One might look like a cat, a bird, or a horse.



Next you will see the Sisters of SHHH led by the Queen. They are all in white and will go "SHHH" to let you know Krampus is coming.



Are you ready for Krampus? He's covered in fur with big horns and a long tongue. According to the legend if you aren't good this is who you will see on Krampus Night.



To let you know Krampus passed safely passed by and everything is okay you'll see St. Nicholas dressed in red with a tall hat and staff sounded by his protective fairies.





Next you will see the Marines with a red sparkly sleigh collecting toys. The parade is over when you see the police car with its flashing lights.



During the parade you may get a throw or even get a bell or a special lump of coal.
